Abeid Amani Karume International Airport is named after the island's first president and it is the main airport in Zanzibar located on Unguja Island. The airport caters for both domestic flights and an extensive number of international flights.

Passport

- ➔ Ensure your passport has 6 months of validity from the date of entry.
- ➔ Non-East Africa Community (EAC) Citizens who require a Visa are kindly reminded to visit the nearest Tanzanian Embassy or Consulate of their country of residence. Alternatively, arrangements can be made to receive one on arrival.
- ➔ Please Visit visa.immigration.go.tz for detailed Visa information.
- ➔ Participants are advised to have their return ticket, passport, invitation letter, yellow fever card, and copies of confirmed accommodation.

Health Requirements

Proof of Covid-19 vaccination or pre-departure COVID-19 TEST is no longer required for travelers arriving in the country.

Check with your travel consultant or local medical practitioner on current medical advice on typhoid fever, cholera, and hepatitis.

→ Yellow Fever

A valid Yellow Fever Certificate is a MUST.

Weather

The weather in Zanzibar between March and May is characterized by heavy rainfall and high humidity with daily temperatures averaging 30°C (86°F).

Do's and Don'ts for Zanzibar Experience

»»Do's

- ✓ **Respect Local Culture** – Zanzibar is predominantly Muslim. Dress modestly, especially in Stone Town and local villages.
- ✓ **Wear Light & Breathable Clothing** – The island is hot and humid, so cotton or linen clothes are ideal.
- ✓ **Use Reef-Safe Sunscreen** – Protect your skin and the marine ecosystem when snorkeling or diving.
- ✓ **Ask Before Taking Photos** – Always ask for permission before photographing locals, especially in rural areas.
- ✓ **Bargain Politely** – Haggling is common in markets, but do so respectfully.
- ✓ **Stay Hydrated** – Carry a reusable water bottle and drink plenty of fluids.
- ✓ **Try Local Food** – Enjoy Zanzibar's rich flavors, including seafood, spices, and Swahili dishes.
- ✓ **Respect Wildlife** – When visiting Jozani Forest or marine reserves, avoid touching or feeding animals.

»»Don'ts

- ✗ **Avoid Revealing Clothing in Town** – Bikinis are fine on private beaches, but cover up in public areas.
- ✗ **Do Not Touch Coral Reefs** – Snorkeling and diving should be done with care to avoid damaging marine life.
- ✗ **Avoid Plastic Bags** – Zanzibar has banned plastic bags to protect the environment.
- ✗ **Do Not Litter** – Always dispose of waste properly, especially in natural reserves.
- ✗ **Don't Drink Tap Water** – Stick to bottled or filtered water to avoid illness.
